The NADINE Platform

- Supporting the integration of refugees, asylum seekers, and vulnerable migrants
- Skill assessment through open data and artificial intelligence
- The platform can facilitate finding employment and provides additional information (e.g., through the interactive chatbot)
- For migrants and local authorities
- Pilots (in Greece, Spain, Belgium)



Pilots (2019-2021)

- ► Greece, Spain, Belgium
- Collaboration with local NGOs
- Number of pilots per pilot phase:

Use case	Real-life pilot	Assisted pilot	Driver pilot	Total
Asylum seekers	52	104	44	200
Refugees	51	50	29	130
Vulnerable migrants	40	57	23	120
Total	143	211	96	450



What is a community-based approach?

- Displacement leads to distruption of all aspects of life
- Taking into account the needs of migrants and the role of local authorities
- Community-based intiatives address the individual challenges migrants face
- Through a community-based approach
 - Individuals and communities are mobilised and supported
 - Community structures are re-established
 - Migrants' individuals rights are protected and respected

The role of local communities

- The integration process depends on the local context
- Local authorities:
 - First point of contact
 - Provide essential services
 - Guarantee a safe environment
 - Promote long-term integration
- Civil society organisations:
 - Fill in the gaps local authorities leave in the integration process
 - Provide guidance and support to migrants
- A multi-stakeholder approach involving local authorities and civil society organisations ensures processes that correspond to the needs of migrants

The role of migrant communities

- Importance of migrants' feedback:
 - NADINE platform:
 - The platform targets migrants with higher education levels and higher ICT skills
 - The job recommendations were not fitting as these were mainly low-level jobs below their qualifications
- Family reunification:
 - Migrants moving where they already have families have a faster integration process
 - Their attachment to the labour market in their host country is more secure

Outcomes

- As the lives of migrants improve, so will their economic and social standing
- Local residents play a role in the quality and effectiveness of the integration process
- Social connections within local communities are enhanced
 -> their ability to integrate more migrants increases
- Increased empowerment for both migrants and local communities
- Resilient communities

Recommendations

- Having a dialogue with migrants:
 - Taking into account migrants' feedback on integration processes
 - Considering their wants and needs, and their qualifications
- Supporting community-building initiatives
 - CALM (Belgium, France)
 - Taste of Home (Croatia)
 - More initiatives and ideas can be found on the European Website on Integration
- Achieving synergies between local authorities and CSOs
